DISPLAY OF FEMININE FINERY AT THE ORPHEUM

Mere Man Can See Exhibition Without Blushing or Flinching—Virtues in New Acts on Bill and No Faults in Any

Beauty of face and beauty of dress combine in "The Fashion Show," the headliner of the week at the Orpheum, to make up a most attractive act. The living models are dressed in full view of the audience in handsome gowns designed by the "chicken dresser" himself, Hugo Jansen. The appearance on the stage of the models daintily but scantily garbed prior to being dressed gives mere man the impression at first that he is some place where he has no business to be, but he does not blush or flinch and after the gowns have been properly arranged in place, he concludes that after all there was nothing terribly shocking about it and that it was just as well he was there to enjoy the splendid effects of the finished dresses.

Although the nature of the act compels the models to appear in public garbed in a way not usually considered decorous, yet the absolute lack of suggestiveness in the talk and the actions of the characters makes the act what it really is, a beautiful display of feminine finery accompanied by good clean comedy, appealing both to the esthetic sense and to the sense of humor of the onlookers.

Hugo Jansen, the proprietor of the modiste shop, is a good comedian as well as a deft designer of fashions, Mada Berger, as Mimie, is a pleasing singer, and Erl Corr as Hyram Corncrib and Blanche Latell, as his daughter, Neurgaigia, are ridiculously funny. The three models add attractiveness to the production by their facial beauty, but that has nothing to do with the gowns and may as well be ruled out of the discussion.

Another Really Good Act
The other really good act on this week's bill is a playlet, "Twenty Odd Years," exceptionally well presented. Harry Beresford as "Nunkey," guardian of a love sick niece, can create comedy by a glance properly placed and in his speech is richly funny.

With the exception of a piano accompanist, the other performers on the bill all come in pairs. Their accomplishments include vocal music, attempts at vocal music, tight rope walking, clever and quasi-clever dialogues, and dancing both elegant and not so elegant. The bill has many virtues in a few acts and no faults in any.

\$15,000 ASKED FOR SHAFT IN HONOR OF MOLLY PITCHER

Memory of the "Only Woman Cannoneer" of the Revolutionary War to Be Perpetuated by Monument in Carlisle if Measure Is Passed

The bill introduced in the Senate this morning by Senator Martin, of Cumberland, for the erection of a monument in Carlisle to commemorate the heroine of the battle of Monmouth in 1778, known in history as "Molly Pitcher," and providing for the appointment of a commission to select a model and supervise the erection of the shaft, carries an appropriation of \$15,000.

In the preamble of the bill gives a history of the famous heroine. Mary Ludwig, of Carlisle, married John Hays, of Carlisle, and John enlisted in the Continental army. At the battle of Monmouth on June 28, 1778, John Hays was shot down at the mouth of his cannon and before the command could be obeyed "to the rear with the unmanned gun," "Molly Pitcher" took the place of her husband and served for eight hours, rallying the troops and assisting in winning the battle, for which heroic action she was called before Washington and brevetted a sergeant, the French troops calling her El Capitano or Captain Molly.

Mary returned to Carlisle with her husband, and after his death she married a man named McCauley, who also died, and then Pennsylvania gave Molly a pension of \$40 a year "for services rendered in the Revolutionary war," indexed "Molly McKelley, Revolutionary heroine," the only woman so indexed in the archives of Pennsylvania. She signed vouchers for this pension, according to the history accompanying the bill, in some of which she spells her name McKelley and some McCauley.

The citizens of Carlisle erected a humble monument to mark her grave in the old graveyard at Carlisle, but the State has never erected a proper monument to the only woman cannoneer of the Revolutionary war.

The bill names as a commission to select the plan for the monument and erect it: Roy L. Schuyler, Lock Haven; William A. Rupp, Carlisle; William S. Waaker, Philadelphia, and Herman A. Miller, of Easton, together with three other citizens of the State to be appointed by the Governor. The commission will serve without compensation except traveling and incidental expenses.

The bill was referred to the Committee on Appropriations.

An opponent of the bill told the Governor that the bill has already been in committee a month, to which the Governor replied that he was fully aware of the status of measure.

Then he followed this up by notifying the committee members that he proposed to keep tabs on those who oppose the local option bill, and if it is defeated, he said, he will in 1916 go into the district of every man who opposes it and oppose its re-election to the House. That was about all that passed between the Governor and the committee, but the bill will not be reported out until the Governor gives the word.

The story created great excitement in Legislative halls last night, and with some it was considered the beginning of a contest between certain legislators and the Governor.

Chairman Williams, of the House Law and Order Committee, last night presented in the House a petition signed by 1,000 inmates of the Eastern Penitentiary to consider favorably any bill for the curtailment of the sale of intoxicating liquors in Pennsylvania.

HUNDREDS TURNED AWAY AT MAJESTIC LAST NIGHT

House Is Packed for First Performance by Thurston, Modern Merlin, Who Does Stunts Which Are Really Marvelous

Hundreds of persons were actually turned away at the Majestic Theatre last night, where the magician, Thurston, gave his first performance here this season. The house was sold out some time before the doors opened. Although the initial rush was due to the reduced rate made possible by coupons issued by the Star-Independent, the audience this afternoon was also a large one and indications are that the performances to-night and to-morrow afternoon and night will draw additional big crowds.
