At Bow Memorial School in Bow New Hampshire, a school which includes grades 5-9 Christa taught English and I taught World History to the same 9th graders. Christa's ability to diagnose the needs of individual students and to create learning situations in which those needs could be addressed was admirable from any point of view. She was able to challenge bright students and make sure that lower level students had the hands-on experiences which would help them to succeed.

Classroom space at the school was designated by low bookcases in a large open area. A potentially difficult teaching environment was made more manageable by Christa's thoughtfulness and ability to work with people. Her cooperation during group projects, last-minute assemblies and day-to-day classroom management made her an invaluable member of our team.

One of Christa's unique skills is an ability to see beyond the confines of her classroom and to communicate her concerns in a positive way. While at Bow Memorial, she was instrumental in establishing a Faculty Advisory Committee, set up to discuss school-wide problems and recommend constructive action to the administration. That committee, under her direction, created a Discipline Policy for the school which succeeded in turning an unruly building of 400 students into a well-ordered learning institution.

As President of our local teacher's association, Christa often implemented creative ways to negotiate with the School Board and to help weak teachers without them feeling threatened.

Christa is a wonderful role model for teachers. She is concerned, capable, and creative in her approach to education to people in general. I am delighted to recommend her to you for your space program.
